**Strengthening the Sales Control of
Pharmaceutical Products containing "Diprophylline"**

The Drug Office of the Department of Health, an executive arm of the Pharmacy and Poisons Board ("the Board") reminds you that strengthening the sales control of pharmaceutical products containing diprophylline (other than pharmaceutical products containing the concerned ingredient for human parenteral administration which are currently being regulated as prescription medicines) used as a bronchodilator in reversible airways obstruction will become effective on **11 December 2021**.

In this connection, the registration certificate holders of the above affected products should comply with the labelling requirements by including a bilingual statement of "**Drug under Supervised Sales 監督售賣藥物**" on the sales pack of the products.

I wish to draw your attention that any illegal sale of Part 1 of Schedule 10 poisons without supervision of a pharmacist, and sale of medicine not complying with the above labelling requirements is an offence under the Pharmacy and Poisons Ordinance and its Regulations. The maximum penalty of each offence is a fine at level 6 (currently \$100,000) and two years' imprisonment upon conviction.

The Department of Health will take enforcement actions for contravention of the labelling requirements after the effective date of the amendments. You are therefore advised to take note of the above and to comply with the legal requirements accordingly.
